#### Dr Jamie Fairbrother: Mathematical models for decision-making processes

Host: Prof. Dr. Marc Goerigk (Chair of Business Decisions and Data Science)

Dr. Fairbrother, who works on the development of mathematical methods to reduce uncertainty in decision-making processes, kicked off the afternoon. His research focuses on how data reduction and more precise models can increase the predictive power of analyses – a topic that is particularly relevant in business and political decision-making.

### Dr Oleksandr Fylypchuk: The Mission of Bruno of Querfurt in the 10th Century

Host: Prof. Dr. Thomas Wünsch (Chair of Modern and Contemporary History of Eastern Europe and its Cultures)

Another topic was presented by Dr. Fylypchuk, who focuses his research on the mission of Bruno of Querfurt. Bruno, an 11th-century missionary, played a key role in spreading Christianity in Eastern Europe. Dr. Fylypchuk analyses how the religious and political motivations of this mission shaped medieval Europe and how it affected later history.

## Prof. Dr. Sandra Leaton Gray: Scenario Planning in Bavarian School Education

Host: Prof. Dr. Jutta Mägdefrau (Chair of Educational Science with a focus on Empirical Research on Teaching and Learning)

Prof. Dr. Leaton Gray's research focuses on the application of future thinking and scenario planning in the Bavarian school system. She also investigates how artificial intelligence can improve the teaching and learning process and prepare schools for technological and social change.

#### Prof. Dr. Vezzosi: Moral Discourse in Democracies

Host: Prof. Dr. Oliver Hidalgo (Chair of Political Science with a focus on Political Theory)

Finally, Prof. Dr. Vezzosi presented his research on the role of moral discourse in modern democracies. Prof. Dr. Vezzosi is investigating how moral arguments influence public debate and how these discourses can strengthen or weaken trust in democratic institutions.
